Much Achieved – Much Still to Do

In my time as your MS we have seen projects like:

- the investment in the Metro network, new stations built and new trains running on the Rhymney and Merthyr lines.
- The redevelopment of Prince Charles hospital.
- The A465 Heads of the Valleys road improvements.
- New schools built and school buildings redeveloped.
- A new bus station.
- The Rhydycar swimming pools refurbished.
- Business investment and town centre regeneration.
- Investment in important housing projects - including Bryn Carno in Rhymney - delivered.
- Vital support to help local community and Third Sector groups.

As always there is more to do and there will be much at stake in the 2026 elections. Those are the challenges to come for my successors in the Senedd.

Welsh Government

I am proud of the record of our Welsh Government. It is too easy to take for granted the long standing policies in support of free bus passes, free prescriptions and free hospital parking. These are political choices, they are Welsh Labour choices. The same principles put in to action that saw Wales retain EMA and provide free school meals to all primary school children. A commitment to retain and grow Flying Start and provide support in the first 1000 days of a child's life. A recognition of the climate crisis and seeking to focus investment in prevention and mitigation including investment in flood defences. We have started the process to modernise the law around coal tips in order to tackle the legacy of the coal industry. I am proud to be taking through legislation on removing private profit from the care of looked after children in care and improving their life chances.

We continue a proud record of investment in new and refurbished school buildings across Wales. We have delivered major investment to start turning around the neglect of our rail system.

In my term of office as your MS we all faced the unparalleled demands of the global covid pandemic and I still think of those who lost loved ones to the virus. In spite of the huge efforts of front line staff, along with record investment, our Welsh NHS and care services are still seeking to recover. But it remains a service to be proud of and to protect and promote in future.

There were other significant problems that took much time and energy to address. I know that I could not solve every problem put before me but, I hope, people can accept that is not for any lack of effort.

The work goes on

I will of course continue to serve you and to do my best until the next election. I thank you all, especially the party members and the voters of Merthyr Tydfil and Rhymney.

I send my best wishes to those who will stand to represent Welsh Labour in 2026. You will have my full support.
